Dear Families

A shorter newsletter this week as I am away at Whitehall with Oak Class who are having a fantastic time. Mrs Bott will be adding some pictures for you to look at, in case you are not on Facebook. This week, we have continued to explore the value of forgiveness and what it really means to forgive someone. The children have learnt about the story of Zacchaeus, who after meeting with Jesus, started doing good in the world. We have been thinking about how we can do good in and around school, and in our wider community. This week, Mrs Richardson has been organising our Ethos group and we have had a number of children put themselves forward for this exciting role. The difficult task now is to choose 4 representatives who will be visiting St George's in Hyde on Monday afternoon to work collaboratively with a cluster of schools from across our Diocesan network. This group of children will be responsible for helping to develop the vision and values at Tintwistle alongside all involved in our school community.

Across the school, children have continued to unpick their latest reading books and have been producing some excellent work. I have been delighted with the calm and purposeful learning atmosphere which has been evident around school.

In EYFS and KS1 the unit this half term is based around castles, queens and kings. The work of Apple Class on the books 'The King's Pants' and 'The King's Hat' has been brilliant. Children have been building their own castles in their construction and workshop area which has been a lot of fun! Meanwhile, in Cherry Class the Year 2's have been sculpting marvellous, magical, mystical dragon eyes from clay.

Whilst in KS2, Years 3 and 4 are learning the Roman Empire and Years 5 and 6 are studying the Ancient Egyptians.

You should have received a text about hot chocolate next Friday, we are looking to boost school funds and every little helps. Look out for more Friday treat days as we will be putting on a variety of things to help raise some money for the benefit of our children. Apple Class families please look out for an invitation to collective worship on 15 February at 3.00pm. The children will be delivering worship and telling us about their exciting RE topic about Jesus the Teacher. We are intending for each class to deliver a collective worship throughout the year to their families and we are starting with our youngest class. More details to follow.

These amazing dragon eyes have been sculpted by the children in Cherry Class!


